Art Studio 11/12 (Griffin) promotes intellectual development by expanding students' capacities for creative thought and encouraging critical-thinking skills such as curiosity, open-mindedness, persistence, and flexibility. Students maintain an art journal and continue to be exposed to a variety of mediums that reinforce the principles and elements of art and design, including, but not limited to, charcoal and pastels, clay, paper mache, watercolour/acrylic/oil/spray paint, sculpture, wire, ink, and mixed media. Images are created, communicated, responded to, and perceived within personal, social, cultural, and historical contexts, and each project is completed with a personal reflective artists' statement. Through studio/classroom work, visits to artists' studios and postsecondary institutions, students gain a better understanding of the role and commitment required to be a successful artist. Students gain increasing confidence in their abilities as artists. In-depth exploration of drawing and painting, printmaking and sculpture enable the creation of work for the annual year-end exhibition.

****Social Justice 12 and Creative Writing 12** will be offered if there is enough interest. Social Justice will be offered outside of the timetable at 7:00 AM.

*****Introductory Spanish 11** The Ministry of Education considers Introductory Spanish 11 a grade 11 language course. However, not all universities recognize a grade 11 "Introductory" language course a grade 11 language course. Therefore, if your child is taking Introductory Spanish 11 next year and is hoping to use the course as a language requirement to enter a program at university, **double check with the university that an "Introductory" level language course meets the university's requirements.**

Selected Studies

Students must earn a minimum of 80 credits at Immaculata Regional High School in Gr. 10, 11 & 12, of which 48 must be from the above required courses. The **elective courses** should be appropriate to their career and/or post-secondary plans.

- (a) At least 16 of the 80 required credits must be Grade 12 level courses.
- (b) Of the 80 credits for graduation, up to 12 can be locally developed courses (referred to as Board Authority Authorized courses).

* Theology 12 is a Board Authority Authorized course and is a graduation requirement at Immaculata. Graduating students **must pass** Theology 12 to be eligible to take part in the Graduation ceremonies.
